Call for papers

IALE Europe and Ghent University are pleased to invite you to Ghent for the IALE 2017 European Congress. The theme of the congress reflects that landscape ecology as a meeting point - where pattern and process meet people and action - is seen as a way of thinking when dealing with European landscapes. We want to emphasise the integration of pattern and process as a biophysical component of landscape ecology with people and action, applying social and cultural approaches. This requires a true interaction between natural and social sciences and between science, policy and practice.

Call for papers

There is an open call for papers in all symposia of the congress. Abstract submissions for presentations or posters are welcome from people working in research, policy and practice. Abstracts are limited in length to 3000 characters (excluding references). Beside this text, you may also upload one A4 page of images and/or tables. Depending on the symposium organisers, contributors whose abstract is selected, might be invited to submit a longer paper. All abstracts will be published in the congress proceedings as an eBook and print-on-demand hard copy.

Overview

During this congress, current trends and future perspectives of landscape ecology will be discussed in light of current societal, political and global challenges. The overall congress theme "From pattern and process to people and action" will be discussed through three connecting threads/leitmotivs in both academic and social aspects of the event. One of these leitmotivs is landscape as a **meeting point**. Landscape embodies a constant dynamic interaction between nature and people, rural and urban, the past, present and future, … Landscape ecology holds a key role in studying these different dynamic relationships and interactions in the landscape. At the congress, natural, social and cultural science will come together with policy and practice; established methods and techniques will come together with innovative approaches; scientific theories will come together with local knowledge and applications.

The second important aspect of the congress will be **reflection**. As IALE celebrates its 35th birthday, this is a good moment to reflect about current trends and approaches in landscape ecology and to look forward to future directions in research and practice. This calls for in depth

debate and **interaction** among the congress participants, which brings us to the third thread through the congress. The congress aims to be a creative and interactive knowledge hub for participants from all landscape-related disciplines to exchange ideas and experiences. The open call for symposia and abstracts makes it your congress. Different formats of sessions, field trips, workshop sessions and social events will stimulate interaction between all participants. The congress will have a European focus but we look forward to welcoming participants from around the world.

Symposia

Following an open call for symposia, seven different thematic clusters were distinguished. These thematic clusters will be organised in parallel sessions ensuring strong thematic lines combining complementary symposia. Next to the parallel sessions, the different poster sessions (linked with the different symposia) throughout the congress will be an important way to present research.
